CANADA PENSION PLAN Questions & Answers

Q. I recently moved. How do I notify the Canada Pension Plan of a change of address?

A. Notification can be submitted by use of the regular post office change of address form, or by letter, addressed to the Canada Pension Plan, Department of National Health & Welfare, Ottawa, Ont. K1A 0L1. Please make sure you give your old address, your new address, as well as the Social Insurance Number under which your benefit is being paid. You can also change your address by contacting your nearest Canada Pension Plan district or local office.

WRITE IT READY

The following list of copy rules has been prepared for two reasons: to make our job somewhat easier, and to assist you in preparing information for submission to your local newspaper.

An attempt to follow these suggestions will greatly increase the possibility of your submission being published without error.

1. Copy should be typewritten whenever possible or, if handwritten, be completely legible (we can't print what we can't read).
2. All material must be double-spaced.
3. Use only one side of the paper.
4. All items should be written in the third person and should include the name of the organization concerned in the first paragraph.
5. When a story must be shortened (in order to fit the space available) this is normally accomplished by cutting from the end of the item. For this reason, the most important elements of any story should be contained in the first few paragraphs.
6. Pictures are a welcome addition to any story, but both should arrive at the newspaper office at the same time, to avoid confusion. Photos should be accompanied by a caption.
